- ★ Free public visits every second Friday of the month from 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
- → Visitors should expect a 90-minute tour, from their arrival at 5:00 p.m. at the Gemini North Base Facility, located at 670 N. A'ohoku Place, Hilo, Hawai'i. The tour will conclude with outdoor Moongazing and discussion.
- → Tour the Gemini North remote Control Room, learn about the most recent science, and participate in Moongazing (weather and moon phase permitting).
- → All ages welcome! Minors under six years old must be supervised at all times.
- → Max. 20 visitors per tour; reservations are needed in advance.
